PROGRAM OVERVIEW

HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY is the digital framework medical professionals use to manage and share health information while maintaining security, accuracy, and quality.

HIT is an Associates of Applied Sciences program. This program prepares students to sit for exams to earn the Certified Coding Associate (CCA) credential, Certified Coding Specialist (CCS) credential and the Certified Coding Specialist — Physician (CCS-P) credential. These credentials are considered mandatory coding certifications in many healthcare settings and contract coding companies.

Within a week of the deadline, selected applicants are notified.


Selection Into Program

HIT PROGRAM SCHEDULE

SCHEDULE

- Program courses and labs meet virtually one evening per week.
- Clinical rotations will be held during daytime hours on weekdays.
- Students can expect to need several hours of study time per credit hour which is stated in each syllabus.

LENGTH

- This program is available to fulltime or part-time students.
- Students need to be able to commit to the HIT program schedule regardless of whether they are full-or part-time.
- Courses are offered once per semester per academic year.

Complete with a grade of C or higher by the end of program's first year:

HIT PREREQUISITE/COREQUISITE COURSES

It is strongly recommended that the student have the general education courses completed prior to enrollment in HIT courses. This is due to the strenuous nature of the program as well as the fact that these general education courses must be completed prior to graduation.

HIT GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES

IMMUNIZATIONS

- Hepatitis A − 2 doses
- Hepatitis B 3 doses
- MMR 2 doses
- TDAP in last 10 years
- Varicella 2 doses
- Influenza in last year
- TB Skin Test/Gold Test in last year
- Some take up to 6 months to complete
- A titer test showing full immunity will also be accepted
- Renew TB annually and Flu seasonally
- Check with your physician and the CDC for proper immunization protocols.



COVID 19 STATEMENT


The health and safety of our Tarrant County College District (TCCD) community are responsibilities that we all share. TCCD does **not** require the COVID-19 vaccine to access TCCD properties or to participate in campus activities.

However, TCCD's partners may require vaccination for students enrolled in technical programs that require the fulfillment of onsite practicum/clinical coursework at one of our partnering facilities. Students in technical programs with a practicum/clinical component may be required by the partnering facility to have the vaccine to complete the practicum/clinical requirement at the partnering facility. Several hospitals require technical program students to be fully immunized against COVID-19 before arrival at the facilities.

As a result, practicum/clinical sites for unvaccinated students may be limited; therefore, graduation may be delayed if students decline clinical/practicum assignments at sites requiring vaccination.
